### The Newfield Foundation: Giving Back to the Community

The Newfield family is passionate about supporting community, cultural, environmental and medical programs. This year marks the eighth anniversary that the Newfield Foundation has been supporting these programs in the communities where Newfield operates. The Foundation has allocated more than \$2 million in funds since its creation. Last year the Foundation allocated nearly a half million dollars.

“Our charity base changes annually based on employee feedback,” said Dolores Vasquez, Executive Director of the Foundation. “The Foundation is driven by our employee involvement and the application process.”

In the past, the Foundation has contributed to organizations like the Duchesne County Children’s Justice Center in Utah, the Houston Zoo, The Texas General Land Office Adopt-a-Beach Program, and Clarehouse in Oklahoma—all programs that were sponsored by Newfield employees.

For example, Jim Metcalf, vice president of Drilling and a Board member of Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS), was an integral part in obtaining Foundation support for BBBS in Houston. He was recognized as Big Brother of the Year in 2006.



Applications can be sponsored by all employees, retired employees and Directors. Each year the cycle begins on August 1<sup>st</sup> and the deadline for submitting an application is September 30<sup>th</sup>.
